## M. D. DIMITRY DIES AT SHREVEPORT

## Body Will Be Brought to New Orleans for Funeral and Burial

Shreveport, La., Oct. 21.—M. D. Dimitry, local attorney, died this afternoon from pneumonia and heart disease at the age of 55 years. He had been ill since Friday when he entered a sanitarium. The body will be taken tonight to New Orleans, where funeral services will be held and interment made in Metairie cemetery.

Mr. Dimitry was born, in New Orleans in 1874, son of the late Theodore J. Dimitry. He moved to Shreveport about ten years 290, and since had engaged in the practice of law. His mother, Mrs. T. J.
