THE DEMOCRATIC PRIMARIES HELD.

No Opposition in Any of the City
Wards,

And No Opposition to Congressman
Meyer or Davey,

So That There Was Little Interest
Displayed,

And the Conventions To-Day Prom-
ise to be Harmonious, Unusu-
ally and Quiet.

A primary election was held in the
First and Second congressional districts
to select delegates to the state nominating
convention, which will be held in Baton
Rouge on the 4th of June, and to the
congressional district nominating conven-
tion, which will be held in this city on
May 20.

A very light vote was cast throughout
the city, there being no opposition what-
soever in any of the wards. It was con-
ceded that Hon. Adolph Meyer would be
the nominee for the First and Judge
Robert C. Davey for the Second congres-
sional district, both candidates being the
present incumbents of the respective of-
fices to which they will be nominated.

The results of the election were received
at the Choctaw Club, Messrs. Henry Du-
castelle, secretary, and Jake Voltrach,
assistant secretary of the parish com-
mittee, consulting the returns.
