**THE COMMON COUNCIL.**—There was an adjourned meeting of both Boards of the Common Council last night.

The Board of Assistant Aldermen proceeded, the newly elected members, being in their seats, to effect a permanent organization.

Mr. Lagan, of the Second Ward, presided.

Messrs. Grandpré and Camp protested against the meeting of the Board, contending that it was illegal.

Mr. George Pandely was elected President of the Board by acclamation.

Mr. Jno. Tobin was reelected Secretary, by acclamation, as was Mr. Chas. Fonda, the Sergeant-at-Arms.

In joint session the Council elected the following named gentlemen as School Directors, to fill the seats of members whose term had expired:

First District—Messrs. Santini and Aitkens.

Second District—Messrs. Hubbard and Sambola, Jr.

Third District—Messrs. Culbertson and Leefe.

Fourth District—Messrs. Huyghe and Correjoles.
